

CULLMAN CITY COUNCIL MEETING ON MAY 11, 2020 IN THE LUCILLE N. GALIN AUDITORIUM

Council President Jenny Folsom called the Cullman City Council Meeting to order at 7:00 o'clock p.m. on Monday, May 11, 2020.

Police Chief Brian Bradberry presented the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
