Council President Jenny Folsom called the Cullman City Council Meeting to order at noon on Friday, September 30, 2022. Police Chief Kenny Culpepper led the Pledge of Allegiance and presented the invocation.

A roll call by City Clerk Wesley Moore reflected the following: Present - Mayor Woody Jacobs, Council President Pro Tem Johnny Cook, and Council President Jenny Folsom, Council Member David Moss, Council Member Clint Hollingsworth. Also present were Attorney Roy Williams and City Clerk Wesley Moore. Absent: Council Member Brad Smith.

Council President Jenny Folsom asked the Council to consider the minutes from September 12, 2022. Council President Pro Tem Cook made a motion to suspend the rules to consider the minutes. Council President Pro Tem Cook made a motion to approve the minutes from September 12, 2022, as written. Council Member Hollingsworth seconded the motion to approve the minutes, and the motion was approved by a roll call vote. REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

- 1. Public Safety (Fire, Police, etc.) In Chairman Brad Smith's absence, Johnny Cook reported on his behalf for the upcoming 2023 fiscal year; sharing that Fire and Police departments have received a new pay scale, Police has budgeted for an additional storage shed, two new fleet vehicles, and office renovations. The Fire Department will receive new, lighter weight turnout gear, and various equipment such as a new cardiac monitor, rope rescue and lift assist equipment.
- 2. Utilities (Water, Sewer, etc.) Chairman David Moss shared regarding the pay increases for the city employees, shared some of the large-scale budgeted projects such as sewer line replacements, water treatment plant improvements, and wastewater screen refurbishment at the South Pump station. Right of Way, Sewer and Water departments will receive several new vehicles and equipment.
- 3. Public Works (Street, Sanitation, etc.) Chairman Johnny Cook reported on several infrastructure and streetscape grant projects included in the FY 2023; an increase in budgeted paving; vehicles and equipment in Street, Traffic and Sanitation departments.
- 4. Tourism (Parks & Recreation, Airport, etc.) Chairman Clint Hollingsworth encouraged everyone to come to come out and enjoy the Oktoberfest event this weekend. Approved budget highlights include improvements to the museum and display equipment; preparations for the new civic center complex and improvements to Depot Park, Heritage Park, Burrow Hamilton Farm, Wild Water, and East Side Park. Budgeted airport improvements include a new hangar, pavement rehab, updated ALP plan and a tractor for mowing.
- 5. General Government (Finance, Economic Development, etc.) Chairwoman Jenny Folsom reported an increase in the general fund budget for FY2023, caused by inflation. The new budget includes funding for updated pay plans and employee pay increases, pay supplement, covered increases for employee benefits; City School fundings through the capital improvement plan, local property and sales tax, and funding the primary school access road.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-32 TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 2021 – 53 DESIGNATING OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF CULLMAN, ALABAMA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULLMAN, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That SECTION IV is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

SECTION IV. The following officers of the City, all of which have some level of authority over employees of the City, exercise some discretionary policy making authority, or a portion of their duties is the ability to discharge some portion of the sovereign power of the City, shall be appointed by the majority of the City Council:

- A. Police Chief.
- B. Fire Chief.
- C. Director of Economic Development.
- D. Sanitation Superintendent.
- E. Street Superintendent.
- F. Wastewater Treatment Plant Superintendent.
- G. Water and Sewer Superintendent.
- H. Garage Superintendent.
- I. Chief Building Official.
- J. Director of Risk Management.
- K. Director of Information Technology.
- L. ROW Maintenance Superintendent.
- M. City Engineer.
- N. Director (Operations) of Parks and Recreation.
- O. Director (Executive) of Parks and Recreation.
- P. Director of Human Resources.
- Q. Court Clerk.

All officers set out in this Section shall serve for one year or until their successors are appointed. All officers set out in this Section shall be directed by the Mayor, and shall report to the Mayor and the designated Committee Chair to keep the Council informed of the operations of their departments. In addition to the normal duties of their respective departments, these officers shall set formal procedures for personal conduct of the employees within their departments not inconsistent with the policies set by the Council and Mayor. All officers set out in this Section are exempt employees (employees at will) and may be removed prior to their term of service without cause by the Council. The Mayor may temporarily suspend or remove any officer, superintendent, chief, or department head in this Section; the suspension or removal of any of the above officials, if sustained by a majority of the Council, shall be final. The Mayor may temporarily fill the vacancy of any office in this Section until a permanent replacement is appointed by a majority of the Council.

3. This Ordinance shall be effective following its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

- Copy of the Contractor's most recent budgets to actual reports (detailed by line item);
- Copy of the Contractor's most current certificate of insurance indicating General Liability and Worker's Compensation insurance.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULLMAN, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the General Fund Budget in the amount of \$52,899,395 or so much as may be necessary to defray the expenses and liabilities of the City of Cullman, is hereby appropriated for said purposes as therein specified.
- 2. That the budget in the amount of \$9,000,000 for the Property and Sales Tax Fund, a major fund, is hereby appropriated for the purposes as therein specified.
- 3. That the Miscellaneous and Special Fund Budgets in the following amounts: Rebuild Alabama Gas Tax Fund \$125,000; Four Cent Gas Tax Fund \$105,000; Seven Cent Gas Tax Fund \$178,000; Lodging Tax Fund \$2,400,000; Industrial Purpose Fund \$105,500; Alabama Trust Fund \$635,000; Corrections and Court Fund \$90,000; Court Judicial Fund \$47,500; Industrial Park Fund \$1,475,000; Industrial Access Road Fund \$5,000; Cullman Building Account \$0; Parks and Recreation Construction Fund \$26,163,211; Transportation Enhancement \$24,346,075; Downtown Revitalization Fund \$998,785; CDBG Neighborhood Projects \$1,086,150; and Debt Service Funds \$21,004,150 or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray the expenses and liabilities of the City of Cullman, are hereby appropriated for the purposes specified therein.
- 4. That the budget for the Sewer Fund in the amount of \$9,129,867; the budget for the Water Fund in the amount of \$22,291,050; the budget for the Utilities Board Water Division in the amount of \$13,943,573; and for the Airport Fund in the amount of \$3,676,954 or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray expenses and liabilities, is hereby appropriated for such purposes as therein specified, together with such expenditures for principal payments and for equipment and capital improvements as authorized by the City Council.
- 5. That a budget for expenses for the Parks and Recreation Fund in the amount of \$6,114,170 or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray expenses and liabilities, is hereby established for such purposes, together with such expenditures for principal payments and for equipment as may be required.
- 6. That such amounts as are required to be transferred between funds for various purposes are hereby appropriated.
- 7. That adjusted classifications, changes in pay and employee benefits, and changes in the positions and structure of departments as implemented in these budgets are hereby adopted.
- 8. This Resolution, if approved by the City Council, shall become effective on the 1st day of October, 2022.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor, the City Treasurer, and the City Clerk are hereby authorized (1) to expend such funds as are herein allocated and as directed by the Cullman City Council and (2) to make such line item adjustments as are necessary to accurately reflect the expenditures of each department and any other changes as directed by the Cullman City Council.
