RESOLUTION NO. 2022-01

IN SUPPORT OF DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, October is Dyslexia Awareness Month;

WHEREAS, Dyslexia is highly prevalent, affecting 1 out of 5 individuals in some form, and crossing racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic lines;

WHEREAS, Dyslexia is a language based learning disability and is defined as a learning challenge that is neurological in origin and characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition, poor spelling, and decoding abilities;

WHEREAS, diagnosis of dyslexia is critical and must lead to evidence based and specialized instruction that is multisensory in nature.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that due to the significant educational implications that may result for students with dyslexia, the City of Cullman supports the Cullman City Board of Education in acknowledging and addressing dyslexia and in providing services needed to ensure the success of affected students;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Cullman supports the Cullman City Board of Education in implementing the Alabama State Board of Education's amendment to the Alabama Administrative Code 290-3-1-.01(20) requiring ongoing dyslexia specific professional development for teachers and other educational personnel and the provision of appropriate educational services for students with dyslexia.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022 - 03

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No 2018-33 prescribing and fixing licenses for the privilege of carrying on business occupations, vocations, and professions in the City of Cullman, and its police jurisdiction for the year beginning January 1, 2022 ending December 31, 2022 and each subsequent year thereafter and prescribing penalties for the failure to obtain a license, and for filing of false affidavits in connection with application for a license.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULLMAN, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Schedule AA is hereby added to Section 18 <u>License Fee Schedule 2018-33</u> setting out the license fee for electric lights and power companies.

Schedule AA. Electric Lights and Power Distribution Companies-

Each person, firm, cooperative, or corporation selling or distributing electricity in the City of Cullman, annually in advance, 3% of gross receipts received by such person, firm, cooperative, or corporation from its operation in the City of Cullman during the preceding year.

<u>Section 2</u>. NAICS Code 221122 Electric Power and Distribution is added to Section 19 City of Cullman License Classification schedule with a rate of AA.

All other sections and schedules not specifically added or amended shall remain in full force and effect.

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law.
